

2010 Reading Girl Scout Achievement Award Application

Qualifications: This award is available to any graduating Reading senior girl whether from Reading Memorial High School, a parochial, private or vocational school. She must be a currently registered scout (either in a troop or as an individual) as of October 1st of the current school year, must have been active in a troop or as a Juliette for at least four (4) years – two of which were beyond the 5th grade; and is going on to any type of higher education.

Requirements: All questions must be answered or the application will not be considered as complete. Please include a letter of reference from someone involved in the Girl Scout community (past or present). Additional sheets of paper may be attached in order to completely answer any question.

Award Process: The Reading Girl Scout Achievement Award Committee will present an award to the recipient(s) upon proof of registration (i.e. tuition receipt, dorm fees, etc.) at an institution of higher learning (i.e. college, technical or vocational school, etc.) The award will remain valid for up to eighteen (18) months beyond the date of high school graduation.

Applications will be considered anonymously. A personal interview will only be required in the event of a tie. Recipients of the award will be notified in early May.
